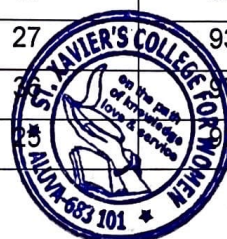
Curricular Aspects

- Mahatma Gandhi University curriculum is followed in the Institution
- Faculty members contributed to curriculum development as members/chairpersons of University Boards of Studies
- Curriculum developed by the Institution for some add-on courses
- 14 UG programmes, Six PG programmes, and Two Research Programmes are available.
- CBCSS for UG and CSS for PG programmes implemented
- Additional skill-based programmes are being offered.
- All stakeholders provided feedback. Feedback from stakeholders on the curriculum was communicated to the university, and the syllabus was modified accordingly.

Teaching-Learning & Evaluation

- Academic calendar prepared and followed by the Institution
- Class rooms and labs equipped with ICT facilities.
- Advanced learners provided with mentoring program - Walk with scholar; Scholar support program supports slow learners and Additional Skill Acquisition Programs provides skills for employability
- 28 permanent faculty members have Ph.D.s, 12 have M.Phil.s, and the majority of the faculty members are NET qualified.
- Study material/e-content prepared by several faculty members
- Active participation of teachers in orientation programs/ refresher courses / workshops / seminars / training programmes
- A high pass rate is visible in all programs

Research, Consultancy & Extension

- A research centre has been approved for the Department of Commerce; the Research Promotion Council coordinates research activities; and research projects funded by the UGC, KSCSTE, ICSSR, and KSHEC are being run alongside student projects funded by the KSCSTE.
- Collaborative research work visible in some departments
- Seminars/workshops/extension lectures organized to inculcate scientific temper
- Research labs equipped with facilities to carry out research
- Institutional research facilities extended to other colleges
- Computational as well as e-learning facilities available
- Library with INFLIBNET/NLIST facility
- Collaborations made with a few organizations
- MOUs are being operated with collaborating institutes.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources:

- 7.46-acre campus with 64 classrooms, 9 seminar halls, 10 technology-enabled spaces, UG and PG laboratories, auditorium, gymnasium, and canteen
- Good infrastructure for teaching, learning, and research
- Indoor and outdoor sports facilities
- Hostel facility for students, faculty, and research scholars; sports hostel facility for 30 students



- Mini media lab for campus radio available
- Library with 581.67 Sq.Mts area and 230 seating capacity
- Library advisory committee is functioning in the Institution
- Automated Library with OPAC, INFLIBNET and Reprographic facilities
- 154 desktops and 21 laptops are available
- The campus is Wi-Fi enabled
- Some classrooms have ICT facilities
- CCTV coverage and public addressing system exist

Student Support and Progression:

- Financial aid provided through institutional scholarships
- The provision of freships to weaker sections
- ED club, Career Development and Placement cell, Grievance Redressal Mechanism, Anti-Sex Harassment Cell, and Anti-Ragging Cell are all in place.
- Student progression from UG to PG courses ranged from 36-53%.
- Active participation of students in co-curricular, extracurricular, sports, and cultural activities and winning many prizes at Inter-University and National level
- There are elected college students' council and student representation in numerous academic and administrative bodies.
- The alumni association actively participates in educational initiatives.

Governance, Leadership and Management:

- Teachers are encouraged to participate in orientation, refresher training, conferences, seminars, and FDP opportunities.
- Quality improvement initiatives run by IQAC
- The primary sources of funding include funds from the UGC, the government, and students' fees. Financial resources from funding agencies are overseen by the finance committee.
- Internal and external academic audits are currently being done on a regular basis.
- Monitoring the teaching-learning process on a regular basis
- Suggestions are made by IQAC for quality improvement and the same is approved by management

- Placement cell needs to be strengthened
- Need more Institution-Industry linkage/Collaboration/MoU
- Need to have spacious laboratories and equipment for M.Sc. Microbiology course
- Faculty needs motivation to publish research articles in journals with good impact factor
- Initiate Resource mobilization for major research projects
