Mr. Abdul Jabbar , the resource person of the election commission handled the class. He reminded the need to participate in the electoral process of the country.

Electoral literacy club also organised a campaign on VVPAT in connection with Loksabha Election 2019 . The election commision authorities exhibited the VVPAT machine and a mock election was conducting . Students and the memebrs of the club were participating the programme and they cast their votes in the mock elctoral process.

Electoral literacy club of the college conducted a survey on the political participation of new electorate in the college. The survey has been conducted in two phases. The first phase of survey is conducted before the General Election 2019. The number of students who are registered for their election ID as well as those who have already got their ID were taken. Then for inculcating the spirit of participation, the electoral literacy club of the college has given an awareness class to the new electorate.
