



- Provide ample platforms for the students to indulge in national and international teaching-learning experience

Research Augmentation

The institution is resolute on developing the culture of diligent Academic Research so as to inculcate analytical and inquisitive thinking among staff and students. Keeping abreast of the research hike in the global scenario, proper operational system is envisioned with the following goals:

- Interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary research has to be promoted in UG, PG and Ph.D Programmes
- Corpus Fund shall be utilised to promote multidisciplinary research
- Faculty orientation should be organized each year on futuristic research to equip the faculty with the recent research trends and methodologies
- To ensure ethical research practice, regular Student Orientation shall be organized on the basics and ethics of research
- Staff and Students shall be motivated for paper presentations and paper publications
- The institution shall enter into MoUs and Collaborations with industries and other institutes for research purposes
- More Funded projects have to be gained from Governmental and nongovernmental agencies to undertake diligent research
- Faculty shall be instigated to achieve cent percentage in Doctoral Degree and Research Guideship

Faculty Development

The quality of the faculty is instrumental in the incremental growth of the institution. Hence, adequate steps have to be taken in sustaining and improving the faculty competence in academics, research and extension.

Student Enrichment

Being the prime stakeholders, students are the strong pillars of the institution. Augmenting the student capacities and enriching the skill-sets of the students are counted significant in the educational process offered by the institution. The following goals will amplify the system methodically:

- To motivate students in academics, more endowments and scholarships shall be instituted
- Mentor-mentee system shall be institutionalized to help cement teacher-student bonding. Regular mentoring sessions shall be provided for the students to seek guidance in cognitive, social and emotional growth
- Remedial sessions shall be arranged for the weak students to help overcome difficulties in academics
- Weekly Counselling Sessions shall be arranged for staff and students rendering the service of a professional counsellor

- Collaborations and linkages with institutions of repute shall be attained. Student exchange programmes shall be promoted with collaborating institutions for research and academic endeavours
- Financial support shall be provided for students to pursue high yielding and socially relevant research projects
- Wide exposure to global educational scenario shall be provided to students through national and international conferences, seminars and workshops
- Bridge courses for UG and PG students shall be arranged prior to each semester commencement
- Student progression to higher studies shall be promoted and rigidly tracked
- Placement drives shall be arranged in the campus to give maximum possibilities of student employment in industry collaborations

Infrastructural Expansion

The growth of the institution is closely linked to the infrastructural expansion as education infrastructure are crucial elements of learning environment. Hence, vital significance is accorded in the strategic infrastructure planning. The college has the following goals in its pipeline:

- To escalate the student strength in the campus, a new Academic block shall be constructed. RUSA and DST-FIST funds shall be utilised for infrastructural development
- The institution shall find means to purchase landed property to expand infrastructural needs
- RFID system shall be installed to make the library fully automated
- Computer software and hardware AMC shall be upgraded for major equipment as per requirement
- Class rooms shall be made ICT enabled to facilitate teaching-learning process

- Smart classrooms and smart boards are a major requirement which has to be upgraded on an immediate effect. At least 10 classrooms shall be transformed as smart classrooms. Accommodate adequate infrastructure to upgrade to autonomous/ deemed to-be- university status
- Language lab facilities shall be updated and new software shall be installed to meet the requirements of the language departments

Administration and Management

Befitting administration and management are the backbone of the institution catering effective and efficient dispensation. To ensure consistent and coherent progression in the realm, the following goals are set:

- To move along the global perspective, e-governance shall be implemented
- Academic and Administrative Audit shall be conducted every year to ensure the felicitous functioning of different bodies
- External audit shall be made mandatory for PTA and OSAX funds to certify transparency
- Green audit, Energy audit and Environment audit shall be conducted on an annual basis to keep track of the sufficiency of resources, future requirements and needed corrections
- To increase the perception of the college and to enhance the quality parameters, the institution shall pursue for ISO certification and national rankings like NIRF
