INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college functions according to the guidelines of NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) and works as a catalyst for improving Academic, Administrative Performance, data collection and documentation through Quality Control, Quality Assurance and Quality Enhancement Initiatives. Its activities focus on curriculum enhancement, enhancing Learner-centric approach, promoting research culture, and organizing training and workshops. IQAC's activity ensures a robust feedback mechanism of all stakeholders and implementation of e-governance, and institutionalization of best practices including accreditation and rankings by various agencies.

IQAC has incorporated Outcome Based Education (OBE) into curriculum since 2019-20 in all programmes of the college and it monitors the effectiveness of OBE implementation through Academic Audit, & Exit Surveys besides other methods devised by it to measure the attainment of Outcomes. The OBE question paper was also prepared under its initiation for the last academic year.

Assessment of learning levels of students in first year and subsequent implementation of Adaptive teaching methods and Blended learning, Mentor-Mentee records, monitoring of Teaching Plans and student evaluation of teaching, Monthly Performance Reports, and various audits are a few institutionalized best practices that IQAC successfully implemented.

Some of the other better-known initiatives of IQAC have been in the field of Green, Energy & Environment audits and Infrastructure audits .

The IQAC spearheaded the accreditation process in February 2023 and the college was accredited in the fifth cycle with A++ grade.
